Currently, we have employee networks, some with regional chapters, across the following communities.

Adapt (Accessibility Employee Network)

- To create a community of support and inclusion for employees and family members to meet the challenges of life while living with physical, mental, and/or cognitive differences.
- To thrive without labels and stigma by removing physical, cultural, and systemic barriers through educational outreach and resources.

Aloha' Aina (Native Hawaiian & Pacific Islander Employee Network)

- To embody the Hawaiian value of “kuleana” or inclusive responsibility by creating a culture that includes Native Hawaiians and Pacific Islanders as part of the Palo Alto Networks hiring and inclusivity strategy.
